Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims for the Public Benefit

The objectives of the charity are to provide free, impartial, comprehensive, confidential and professional information, advice, and advocacy services to all in Mole Valley. The aims and principles of the service are to provide the advice people need for the problems they face; and to improve the policies and practices that affect people's lives.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Trust's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

The Company carries out these objectives by providing the advice service in the following office-based ways:

- by letter, fax and email
- to personal callers on a drop in basis
- by face to face appointments
- by telephone

The Company provides free, confidential and impartial advice to everybody regardless of race, gender, sexuality or disability.

STATEMENT OF INTERNAL CONTROL

Citizens Advice Mole Valley trustee board oversees the information security of all personal information that is processed about our clients, staff, funders and strategic partners. Citizens Advice Mole Valley holds joint responsibility for client data that is held in our case management system, with the national Citizens Advice Service.

An information assurance management team exists to ensure the confidentiality, integrity and availability of all personal and sensitive data is maintained to a level which is compliant with the requirements the General Data Protection Regulation and Data Protection Act 2018.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Company continues to provide a high standard of service to all clients and successfully maintains membership of the National Association of Citizens Advice Bureaux. Our offices have disabled access to the waiting rooms and interview rooms and can offer home visits by prior arrangement.

The Company received £120,000 core funding from Mole Valley District Council being the first year of a 3-year funding agreement.

We were delighted to have been awarded a 5-year grant totalling £297,485 from the Big Lottery Fund starting on 1 January 2017. The total received in 2017/18 was £57,594.

A grant of £12,000 was received from Clarion to provide advice to Clarion customers. A further grant has been agreed for the year from 1 April 2018 from Clarion Futures.

The Company received funding of £23,480 from Sutton and East Surrey Water Company to assist with the administration of the Water Support scheme.

In addition the company received a grant of £5,000 from the Wates Foundation to be used to provide advice to residents of the Leatherhead area.

As a member of Citizens Advice Surrey a grant was awarded to the Company for projects where CAS had obtained grant funding at a County level:

Local Assistance Scheme an allocation of £3,180 to facilitate client access to the Surrey County Council scheme which provides cash payments and goods for people in crisis.

The Dorking Foodbank provided funds to enable an adviser to attend the foodbank.

The Trustees wish to thank all our funders for their support.

Building up additional funding streams remains a priority of the Company.

Areas covered by the Company include welfare benefits, money advice, employment, housing, personal relationships and consumer issues. The Company uses IT based case recording and reporting systems and web based information systems.

In the year 2017/18 the Company dealt with 15,053 issues raised by 3,458 clients contacting the Company by letter, telephone, fax, emails, home visits and visits to the Company offices. The issues being raised are increasingly more complex and time consuming. (2016/17: 13,996 issues by 3,366 clients). This service is provided by our staff including around 60 volunteers who are recruited locally and thoroughly trained to provide quality assured advice.

As part of our Service Level Agreement with Mole Valley District Council, we are required to ask clients to complete a client satisfaction survey. The results are very positive with 99% client satisfaction in service overall.

We would like to thank all our staff and volunteers for their loyal support throughout the year to enable us to deliver these valuable services.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

Incoming resources in the year 2017/18 were £245,327 (2016/17 £228,636).

A deficit of £7,339 arose in the current year, compared with a deficit of £42,925 in 2016/17. As at 31 March 2018, total reserves were £141,392 of which £2,500 were restricted funds and £132,550 were designated funds, leaving general funds of £6,342.

Principal funding sources

The Directors extend their thanks to Mole Valley District Council for their continued support and for providing our core funding (£120,000), and also for the provision of rent-free accommodation and support services for Dorking. Thanks also to our other grant funders who this year provided £103,329 project funding. In addition donations, interest, fundraising and related activities raised a further £21,998.

Citizens Advice Mole Valley did not have any borrowings outstanding, either during the financial year or at the balance sheet date.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

Citizens Advice Mole Valley is dependent on Mole Valley District Council for the provision of the bulk of the funding for core operating expenses. The Company also receives income from minor grants and donations while income from project grants also contributes towards operating expenses. The Trustees recognise that they are dependent upon Mole Valley District Council and that this presents a particular risk to the Company's ongoing operation were Mole Valley District Council forced to cut significantly or terminate the annual grant.

A 3-year grant covering the period 1 April 2017 to 31 March 2020 has been awarded by Mole Valley District Council. The new grant is at a materially lower level than before, with phased reductions over the 3-year period. Current expenditure is running at a level in excess of the Company's income. The Trustees are currently exploring initiatives to bring income and expenditure more into line but in the meantime are drawing on the Company's reserves to make up the revenue shortfall.

The Trustees have carried out a thorough review of the Designated Fund and have determined the amount required at 31 March 2018 to be £132,550 (2017: £121,200) should funding be suddenly withdrawn and the charity wound up. This reflects primarily outstanding contractual lease obligations on the Leatherhead office and operating and staff costs during the wind up period.

Going concern

The Directors have not identified any significant material uncertainty which would cast doubt about the ability of the Company to continue as a going concern, subject to continuing receipt of the core grant, and adapting services to changes in funding.

FUTURE PLANS

The Trustees have in place a Business and Development Plan covering the period from April 2018 to March 2021, implementation of which seeks an overall objective to ensure, assuming adequate funding, that the Company continues to provide services to meet the needs of the local community (both residential and business), and particularly the most vulnerable, and that resources are used to best effect for that purpose.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Citizens Advice Mole Valley is a company limited by guarantee incorporated on 20 May 2003 and is a registered charity. The maximum liability of each member is limited to one pound.

The activities are governed by the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees, who are also directors of the Company, are appointed in accordance with procedures set out in the company's Articles, being individuals from the local community able and willing to assist the Company in furthering its objects, in particular the maintenance of the Company as a centre to provide a free, confidential, independent and impartial service, information and counsel.

Trustee induction

Trustees are given appropriate induction training to enable them to assume their corporate responsibility and to contribute to the strategic direction of the Company.

Organisational structure

Citizens Advice Mole Valley has been operating for over 15 years, serving the people of Leatherhead, Dorking and the surrounding districts. It is an independent, voluntary organization offering a service that is available by visiting in person or by telephone, email or letter. We also participate in 'Adviceline' whereby we and 4 other Local Citizens Advice charities in Surrey pool resources to field telephone enquiries more efficiently.

The charity is staffed predominantly by volunteers who give their time for free and are committed not only to the provision of the service to the public but also to a rigorous schedule of training to keep up to date with a constantly changing legislative and regulatory environment.

Our small team of paid staff manages and administers the charity on a day-to-day basis and ensures that a high quality service is provided.

The members of the voluntary Board of Trustees are the directors of the Company and govern the organisation, making overall policy and defining future strategy. They also monitor the work of the Company management. The Company serves a large mixed urban/rural area covering North and Mid Surrey including Dorking and Leatherhead, called Mole Valley. A local Citizens Advice has been providing advice and support to people of Mole Valley since 1939.

A register of members' interests is maintained and reviewed quarterly to ensure there is no potential conflict of interest.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Related parties

Citizens Advice Mole Valley is a member of Citizens Advice, the operating name of the National Association of Citizens Advice Bureaux, which operates a framework for standards of advice and casework management as well as monitoring progress on a regular basis against those standards. However, the actual day-to-day operating procedures are determined locally within the requirements of the national membership requirements.

The Company also works closely with many local charities and other advisory services on behalf of its clients.

Citizens Advice Mole Valley is a member of Citizens Advice Surrey, a company limited by guarantee incorporated on 23rd February 2011 and which is a registered charity representing the interests of all 14 Local Citizens Advice charities operating in Surrey. The maximum liability of each member is limited to one pound.

Mr. Steven Phillips is a director of Citizens Advice Mole Valley and of Citizens Advice Surrey; he succeeded Mr. Simon Fox as Treasurer on 1 March 2018.

Risk management

The Board of Trustees has conducted its own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and systems have been established to mitigate those risks, this includes the financial Reserve Policy. Internal risks are minimized by the implementation of procedures detailed in the Office Manual for authorisation of all transactions and projects and to ensure consistent quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charitable company. These procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the charity.

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

The Company is limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and also a registered charity. The Charitable Company's registered numbers and registered office address can be found on page 4 in the administrative details of the Trustees report.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Other than reliance on core funding, as mentioned in the Trustees report, there are no material uncertainties about the Company's ability to continue.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Income

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified. Donations and fundraising are recognised in the accounts on receipt. No amounts are included in the accounts for the services donated by volunteers.

IT support services donated during the year by a trustee are included in donations received and expensed in IT support.

Grants have been recognised in the accounts in the period in which they are receivable and are reflected in restricted or unrestricted funds depending on the conditions attached to them.

Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs relating to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of resources. Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with the administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Governance costs

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice. These costs include costs related to Independent Examination and legal fees.

Allocation and apportionment of costs

Overhead and support costs have been allocated between charitable activities on a time basis and are analysed in Notes 7 and 8.

Taxation

The Company is a registered charity and is exempt from United Kingdom income and corporation tax on its charitable activities. No trading activities are undertaken by the Company.

Fund accounting

The general fund is an unrestricted fund which is available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which has not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Donated services

The offices at Dorking are provided by Mole Valley District Council at a peppercorn rent until October 2021.
